**Oakey Health & Wellbeing Expo** – Sunday 16th July , 10 am to 2:30 pm, Oakey Cultural Centre. Showcasing many opportunities in Oakey to get fit, improve your health and wellbeing, come and try a sport, join a group, sing! or volunteer. Entry is Free, Shane Webcke will be speaking from 10:30, and signing jerseys from 11:30. Brian Sams will be doing ‘Seed to Feed’ workshops, and kids can join a ‘Family Foodies’ sessions, or play on the jumping castles. And there’s much more!

**Councillor Visit** – Crs Anne Glasheen and Megan O’Hara Sullivan will be visiting the area on Friday 21st July, expected at Bowenville, near the Hotel, and 9:30 am, and at Jondaryan Hall at c.10:00 am. Residents are welcome to come and chat with the Councillors about any issues or ideas.

**Movie Kit** – Council now has a movie kit, featuring a 3 m x 3m blow up screen, data-projector and speakers, based in Oakey for use in the regional areas outside Toowoomba. If your group wishes to run a movie night as a fundraiser, contact a Community Liaison Officer to book the kit. The kit is suitable to use both inside a hall or outside. **Oakey Creek Linear Parkland** – Contract work is progressing well on upgrading the parks along the Oakey Creek, including a high level pedestrian bridge linking Cherry and Tyrell streets, an Amphitheatre and accessible paths in Arthur Shooter Park, and major upgrades in Rotary Park, including a new toilet block. Work is expected to be completed in September. Council staff are also doing a significant makeover of the gardens at the Civic Precinct, complementing the recent community driven 7-Day makeover in the Oakey CBD.

**An Oakey parkrun event** is being planned, to be based in Arthur Shooter Park, beginning after the current works in the park are complete. <http://www.parkrun.com.au/> is a volunteer facilitated 5km run from 7 to 8 am on a Saturday morning, for people of every ability to take part; from walkers or those taking their first steps in running to Olympians; from juniors to those with more experience; all are welcome. **Lorrimer Street – Bridge** works are now complete, making an all-weather crossing of the Oakey Creek.
